Living in the Auckland area is preferable but not essential. This invitation will be open for two weeks.



# SHIP OF THE WEEK - HMNZS KOURA (Q1350 - P3564)

Q1350 was one of 16 Harbour Defence Motor Launches (HDMLs) delivered to the RNZN in 1943-44. Commissioned on 27 March 1944, it joined the 125<sup>th</sup> ML Flotilla based in Auckland. Placed in operational reserve in July 1945, it was commissioned for use by the Otago RNZNVR Division in November 1948. Renumbered P3564 in early 1950, it was named *Toroa* from December 1951 until commissioned as HMNZS *Koura* in December 1967. When decommissioned in 1984. Koura was decommissioned on 3 March 1984 and handed over to the Historical Maritime Park at Paeroa as a museum ship. She was subsequently sold to a Wellington based owner and has slowly deteriorated through lack of attention. She is currently on the hard at Kopu near Thames, adjacent to ex HMNZS *Tamure*. Also in the same yard is another ML, *Alert*, which was sold by the RNZN immediately after WWII. *Alert* is currently being restored and is due to be relaunched early next year.
